


Where is Albania?

Europe. Albania is bordered by the


Adriatic Sea to the west, Montenegro to

Albanian College Durres


The Mission of Albanian College is to create a positive, holistic, inquiry-based learning environment that embraces the uniqueness and attributes of each member of the school community.




- Albanian, the country's official language, is spoken by almost 98% of the population of Albania.

Cost of Living

Is it expensive to live in Albania?
The Cost of living in Albania is around
1000 euro per month for a single
person, including rent. However, it
can vary for an expat depending on
where they choose to live. This means
that it is possible to maintain a
comfortable lifestyle while spending
less money.

The average cost of food in Albania for inexpensive restaurants is around ALL 850. A meal for two people in a mid-range restaurant for three is around 3,500, which makes the cost of living in Albania affordable.

What to visit?

<u>Amphitheater</u>

The most important historic monument of the city. The evidence of the rich and turbulent history of Durrës. The city was founded by the Greeks in VII B. C. E.

Archeological museum

Perfect place for the ones interested in history and local archeology. The collection of exhibits numbers 2 thousand prehistoric finds in chronological order.



What to visit?

Venetian tower

This piece of history represents the rich past of the city. The Byzantine Empire made Durrës the most fortified city in the Adriatic sea and later was an important region of the Venetian Republic.

Residence of King Zog I

The House of Zogu also known as the Royal Villa of Durrës was built in 1937 on the highest hill of the city and was used as a summer house for Royal Family.




GOLEM

CAPE OF RODON

is not only about the landscape but also a few important historical and cultural monuments of Albania. The cape is known for the location of the Skanderbeg Castle which was built around the year 1450.









Fërgesë is undoubtedly one of Albania's most traditional dishes. The dish consists mainly of tomato sauce, cottage cheese, green peppers and garlic.

Byrek is an appetiser, a snack, a staple at breakfast and is even eaten as a late evening snack. This dish is very typical in all Balkan countries. Albanians usually spell it byrek.

Pispili is another traditional Albanian dish. It is made with cornbread and leeks or spinach. The thickness of the cornbread varies from place to place.

Tavë Kosi is an Albanian casserole with yogurt, eggs, garlic and lamb meat among other ingredients.

The traditional Albanian <u>baklava</u> recipe features layers of flaky phyllo dough, finely chopped walnuts, and a spiced sugar mixture that is baked to perfection and then drenched in a sweet honey syrup.

"Qofte' in Albania are mainly meatballs. Often, in the best 'qebaptore' they appear as small sausages, they are called 'qofte zgare'

Stuffed peppers: Yellow, orange or red peppers stuffed with rice, ricotta and spices, before being baked in the oven. One of the typically Albanian dishes, rich in flavor and also quite healthy

Hasude is an old traditional dessert recipe that is prepared in many parts of Albania. It's a cornstarch-type pudding that's very easy to make, and it's a pretty light dessert, usually served chilled. It has a Turkish origin, although the recipe has been adapted over time.
